Your Goodyear City Council

The Goodyear City Council represents and serves our community as responsible stewards of the public trust. Their job is to set the vision and establish policy for the city.

Goodyear has a council-manager form of government with six councilmembers and a mayor — all elected at-large on a non-partisan ballot. They serve staggered four-year terms.

Yes, the city of Goodyear was named after Goodyear tires! Goodyear was part of 16,000 acres purchased in 1917 for the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company by executive Paul Litchfield. Back then, cotton was used to make rubber tires for airplanes.

Goodyear has a rich history in aviation and aerospace. The airport was a hub for the U.S. Navy and was established as a U.S. Navy air facility to test, fly and deliver aircraft during World War II. Today, it's home to various businesses including fixed base operator Lux Air Jet Centers; AerSale, an aircraft maintenance and repair business; and Lufthansa Aviation Training, a world-class pilot training facility.

The town of Goodyear was incorporated on Nov. 19, 1946. At that time, Goodyear had:

- **151** homes
- **250** apartments
- A grocery store, drug store, barber shop, beauty shop and service station



The past, present and future will all come together at the 75th Anniversary Carnival. You don't want to miss this special celebration taking place at the future heart of Goodyear.

The vintage carnival, a throwback to the 1940s, will include sealing of the city's next time capsule, a Ferris wheel, carnival games and food trucks!

Get to Know Your Fire and Police Departments

Keeping the city safe is a top priority. In a recent community survey, 98% of Goodyear residents said they feel safe in their neighborhood. While you might only think of fire and police when there's an emergency, they also provide many other services and programs.

FREE FIRE PROGRAMS

Child Safety Seat Inspections: Call the Goodyear Fire Car Seat Hotline at 623-882-SEAT (7328) to schedule an appointment.

Home Safe Home Program: In-home safety checks for residents. Call 623-882- SAFE (7233) to schedule an appointment.

Residential Lock Box Program: Allows first responders access to homes during medical or other emergencies where the occupant is unable to open the door. Residents need to purchase the lock.

Fire Pal and Preschool Program: Fire educators visit schools across the city to teach age-appropriate safety lessons. To schedule a lesson, call 623-882-7363.

CPR Training: Certified CPR classes available for groups of ten or more. Schedule a training by calling 623-882-7308.

FREE POLICE PROGRAMS

Citizens' Academy: A 10-week academy to gain a greater awareness and understanding of law enforcement's role in Goodyear. Offered twice a year, in the fall and spring.

You Are Not Alone (YANA): Provides regular phone calls and home visits to seniors who have limited family or community contacts. Seniors can also call the YANA program for help finding specific services and resources. Contact YANA at 623-882-7539 or 623-696-8545.

Vulnerable Population Database: This voluntary registration for residents with mental, physical or health conditions provides critical information for responding officers, including a photo of the resident.

DISPOSE OF PRESCRIPTIONS SAFELY AT A GOODYEAR DROP BOX

There are two secure prescription drug drop boxes in Goodyear to help prevent drugs from entering the wrong hands. Using a drop box is also safer for the environment.

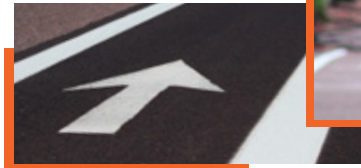


Delivering Exceptional Services For You

The city of Goodyear is much bigger, land-wise, than most people realize. It stretches 34 miles long from north to south at its longest point and 11 miles wide from east to west at its widest point. The city's departments are dedicated to providing you with the best services, which includes maintaining beautiful streets, delivering safe drinking water and providing reliable trash and recycling services.

SAFE, CLEAN STREETS

The city's Engineering Department maintains and repairs more than 400 miles of streets in the city, which is the equivalent distance of driving one way from Goodyear to Albuquerque. That's a lot of roadways, sidewalks, street lights and signs to maintain!



DIGITAL DEVELOPMENT REQUESTS

Goodyear residents can work with the city electronically to request permits. Everything can be sent, reviewed and approved through an online system. Some top reasons you might need a permit:

Building a natural gas or propane BBQ or fire pit

Roofing repair and/or replacement

Air conditioner install and/or replacement

TRASH TALK

In Goodyear, your curbside trash and recycling is collected once a week, both on the same day. With several holidays falling on a weekend this year, the only holiday that will impact your trash, recycling, and bulk pickup for the rest of 2021 is Thanksgiving Day. If your regular service day falls on Thanksgiving, your containers will be picked up on Friday Nov. 26. Friday's customers will receive service on Saturday, Nov. 27. To look up your trash and recycling or bulk pickup days, visit goodyearaz.gov/trash.



CURBSIDE PICKUP

In addition to curbside trash and recycling pickup, Goodyear offers a convenient household hazardous waste (HHW) pickup service. To make it easier for you, the city will pick up items such as paint cans, flammable liquids and household cleaning items from your curb, by appointment. For a list of approved HHW items and to view the collection schedule, visit goodyearaz.gov/HHW.

EVENT PERMITS AND RECORDS

For anyone interested in having a large outdoor event with 250 or more people, the City Clerk's Office can provide guidance to ensure the appropriate steps are taken. You can get started by completing a Special Event application at goodyearaz.gov/cityclerk. The webpage is also a great source of information on elections, public records requests and current openings on boards, commissions and committees.



HUB FOR ENTREPRENEURS

The city offers free facilitated workshops for entrepreneurs and small business owners. Classes take place at the InnovationHub inside the Goodyear Library. View the upcoming classes at goodyearaz.gov/innovationhub.

TRAVELING IN AND AROUND GOODYEAR

Valley Metro, the regional public transit system, provides bus connections from Goodyear to other Valley communities. You can catch a bus at various times across the city, including at the Goodyear Park-and-Ride. They also provide door-to-door transit options for qualified ADA residents. To learn more about these services, visit valleymetro.org. Staying closer to home? You can hop on a Bird. Bird is an electric scooter that can be rented out by the minute by anyone 18-years and older with a valid license or permit. The e-scooters are located across the city. The city also partners with Avondale to provide the Zoom Circulator, connecting riders to local destinations.

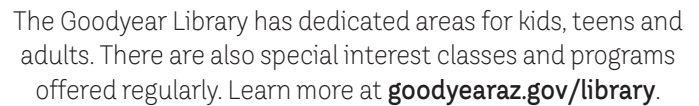
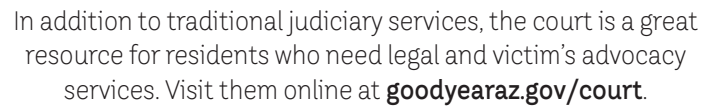

Growing Our Water Supplies

The city's newest water treatment facility is going to be up and running in early December. It will initially treat 8 million gallons of surface water a day, and with future expansion, will reach 16 million gallons a day. The facility will also help diversify the city's water by adding surface water into the mix. Currently, all of the city's water supply is groundwater. With the facility start up, Goodyear water customers may temporarily notice a change to the look, taste and smell of your tap water. This is expected during the transition process. The water is still safe to drink and use.

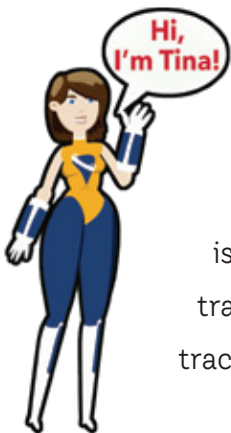
Is there anything the city can do about short-term rentals in my neighborhood? – Gayle

State law prevents cities from banning or restricting short-term rentals; however, if illegal activity is occurring at these residences, including disorderly parties, gatherings or events that involve loud music, disturbances or unruly behavior, please report it to the Goodyear Police Department by calling the non-emergency line at **623-932-1220**. You can also report nuisance behaviors, such as parking issues or property maintenance, to the city's Code Compliance Division at **[goodyearaz.gov/reportproblem](https://www.goodyearaz.gov/reportproblem)**.

How do I contact the Goodyear City Council? – Bob

Public involvement is extremely important to the mayor and council, and they appreciate and value resident input.
