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EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

The July 17 Manager's Information Update highlights continued progress on several key city initiatives, major capital projects and community events. Staff continues advancing critical infrastructure investments, including the Indian School Road widening project between Perryville Road and Citrus Road, the Sarival Avenue Median and Landscape improvements project, and the Goodyear Community Park Improvements project, all of which remain on schedule.

Election preparations continue for the July 21 Primary Election, with approximately 11,500 ballots already cast through early voting as of July 14. Goodyear Ballpark and city hall will be vote centers on Election Day.

Goodyear311 marked its first anniversary in June, having fielded over 5,800 requests since launch and resolving 84% of this quarter's 1,259 requests within seven days. This update also recognizes the signing of HB2800, as DUI enforcement continues to be a priority for the Goodyear Police Department, who joined MADD at the state capitol for the signing of the bill.

Community events included a six-week adaptive programming career exploration camp in partnership with Ability360, a free youth basketball clinic hosted with the Goodyear High School women's basketball team and a proclamation from Mayor Pizzillo recognizing July as Parks and Recreation Month.

INFRASTRUCTURE & PROJECT UPDATES

INDIAN SCHOOL RD: PERRYVILLE RD TO CITRUS RD [CIP #42089]

The city of Goodyear continues to advance the Indian School Road widening project between Perryville Road and Citrus Road, which is currently in the design phase. The project will address the existing scalloped street condition on eastbound Indian School Road by adding two additional through lanes, increasing the total from one lane to three.

Interim improvements are progressing with permit reviews underway. These enhancements will provide four travel lanes within the existing right-of-way.

Design work on the ultimate roadway configuration is also ongoing, including coordination with Maricopa Water District regarding infrastructure relocation and continued real estate acquisition.

State land processes are expected to require 12–24 months. Both interim and long-term design activities remain on schedule to support the future buildout as a major arterial roadway. The project is expected to reach completion by December 2029.

SARIVAL AVE: MEDIAN & LANDSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS [CIP #42105]

The Sarival Avenue Median and Landscape improvements project is in the design phase. The city will construct a new landscaped median approximately 1,000 feet north of Yuma Road, connecting to the existing median. This 435-foot section will include matching landscaping and irrigation. The improvement supports the planned traffic flow for Sarival Marketplace, where the north entrance will be restricted to right-in and right-out turns only. The design team submitted 60% plans in May and will address any revisions before proceeding to 90% plans. Current activities include preparing job order contract documents for construction services.

GOODYEAR COMMUNITY PARK: IMPROVEMENTS [CIP #50058]

The Goodyear Community Park improvements project continues making progress through the design phase and is tracking on schedule. The project will create a dog park in the northeast corner to provide more space and add new features for visitors. Improvements across the park will include new shade structures, ramadas, seating areas, water features and updated landscaping. All park and ballfield lighting will be upgraded from halogen to

to energy-efficient LED lighting. Both playgrounds will be completely replaced, including new equipment, shade canopies and updated safety surfacing.

In May, the city issued the contract for preconstruction services related to the playground renovation, while the design team progressed toward the 60% design submittal planned for early June. June activities included a review of the 60% design package and construction cost proposals for the dog park relocation and playground renovations. The city is also awaiting notification of a Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant award, which would supplement project funding. The overall project is on track for completion in September 2027.

PROGRAM UPDATES

CANDIDATE ELECTION UPDATE

The Primary Election will be held next Tuesday, July 21. Vote Centers will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day. Early in-person voting remains available through Saturday, July 18 and again on Monday, July 20. City facilities serving as Vote Centers include city hall and Goodyear Ballpark.

As of July 14, approximately 11,500 ballots have been cast through early voting.



On Election Night, unofficial election results will be distributed to the mayor and council via email shortly after 8 p.m., following the initial release of results by Maricopa County Elections. Additional updates will be provided as results are released by the county. Unofficial election results will also be available on the [city's website](#) through a link to results.maricopa.vote.

Election information and voting reminders will continue to be shared through the city's social media channels leading up to Election Day. A special city council meeting is tentatively scheduled for Aug. 4 at 10 a.m. to canvass the election results.

GOODYEAR311 QUARTERLY UPDATE

From April 2026 through June 2026, 1,259 requests were submitted through Goodyear311. The most common requests, found in the chart below and representing 806 of the total requests submitted, continue to be related to solid waste container exchanges, trash and recycling pickup, pool drain permits, parking, public nuisances, streetlights, weeds and overgrowth and animal nuisances. 84% of requests were addressed and completed within seven days. As of May 27, solid waste container exchange requests are now handled directly through [Utility Access](#). Goodyear311 celebrated its first anniversary in June 2026, having handled over 5,800 requests since its launch.

ADVANCING GOODYEAR INITIATIVE: QUARTERLY PROGRESS UPDATES

Performance measurement data from April 2026 through June 2026 is now available on both the [Performance Measure](#) and [Strategic Plan](#) dashboards. All but two fiscal year (FY) 2026 Strategic Plan action items have been completed – “Goodyear Ballpark Development” and “Departmental Staffing Plans” will be completed in FY 2027.

An RFP process for development around Goodyear Ballpark was conducted in FY26, however, another RFP process is planned for FY27 to gather additional feedback and responses. Additionally, the departmental staffing plans will be discussed with city council in the fall. Now that FY26 is complete, the FY25 action items will be removed from the dashboard in preparation for new action items to be added during the annual Strategic Plan update process this Fall.

GOODYEAR ADAPTIVE PROGRAMMING: CAREER EXPLORATION SUMMER CAMP

Goodyear Adaptive Programming recently concluded a new six-week pilot program designed to help adaptive teens develop transferable workplace skills and prepare for future employment opportunities. Participants built practical job-readiness skills through the Practical Assessment Exploration System (PAES) Lab at Agua Fria High School and attended pre-employment transition workshops led by Ability360. The program concluded on July 9 with a tour of Ability360 and a certificate presentation recognizing participants' accomplishments.

This pilot highlights the value of Goodyear's Adaptive Programming and its commitment to expanding meaningful opportunities for community members of all abilities. The collaboration with the Agua Fria High School District and Ability360 demonstrates how strong community partnerships can provide innovative programming that supports skill development, independence and successful transitions into the workforce.

GOODYEAR YOUTH SPORTS: BASKETBALL CLINIC AT GOODYEAR HIGH SCHOOL

The Goodyear Youth Sports Basketball League partnered with the Goodyear High School women's basketball team to host a free skills clinic for young athletes. Participants trained with high school coaches and players, gaining skill development, mentorship and exposure to higher-level competition.

As a highlight of the season, the clinic strengthened connections between Goodyear's youth sports programs and the high school, encouraged continued basketball participation and demonstrated a shared commitment to developing young athletes and fostering community engagement. The clinic provided an opportunity for participants to practice fundamental skills while interacting with local high school players and coaches.

Officer Howard recently had the honor of attending the bill signing for HB2800 at the invitation of Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD).

DUI enforcement continues to be a priority for the department. In 2025 the Goodyear Police Department made 617 DUI arrests

HB2800 strengthens Arizona's ignition interlock laws by establishing penalties for individuals who knowingly assist drivers in bypassing ignition interlock requirements. The new law represents another important step in Arizona's ongoing efforts to prevent impaired driving and improve roadway safety.

We are proud to see our officers representing the department at events that support public safety and reinforce our shared commitment to protecting our community. Thank you to MADD and all those who worked to make this legislation a reality.

TOP POST OF THE WEEK

The strongest-performing post came from the Goodyear Police Department and promoted the Virtual Block Watch Program, which allows residents to register outdoor security cameras as a potential resource for criminal investigations. The post generated 9,751 engagements, including 1,046 reactions, 930 comments and 80 link clicks. The combination of a neighborhood safety message and questions surrounding privacy and police access prompted substantial discussion and encouraged users to closely review both the post and its accompanying explanation.

Sentiment was mixed and often skeptical, with many commenters expressing concern that the program could create privacy risks or resemble other surveillance systems. Others supported the program and shared examples of camera footage helping investigators solve crimes. The response



demonstrates that public safety technology can generate significant attention, while also reinforcing the importance of clearly explaining how information is accessed, how privacy is protected and what safeguards are in place.
