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EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Unofficial results from the July 21 Primary Election indicate that approximately 99% of ballots have been reported by Maricopa County, with the county's final unofficial results expected on Monday, July 27. The city of Goodyear appreciates its successful partnership with Maricopa County Elections in administering the election, including hosting two county-operated Vote Centers that provided convenient voting opportunities for residents throughout the election period. Voters requiring signature verification on their ballots may complete the curing process at Goodyear City Hall during regular business hours, as well as Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Serafina parking lot has been fully restored following repairs to the privately owned stormwater retention system that caused a sinkhole in October 2025. Major capital improvement projects continue to advance on schedule, including the Rainbow Valley Water Reclamation Facility Expansion, Camelback Road improvements and the Bullard Avenue widening project. These investments will expand critical infrastructure capacity, improve transportation safety and mobility and support Goodyear's continued growth. The attached FY2026 Capital Improvement Program Fourth Quarter Report provides a comprehensive update on city capital projects.

2026 PRIMARY ELECTION UPDATE

Unofficial election results for the 2026 Primary Election are available on Maricopa County's election results website results.maricopa.vote. The city has also shared unofficial results in the city races with media and on the city's website and social media channels. According to the county, 99% of the results have been reported. Their final update for unofficial results will be posted on Monday, July 27.

The city appreciates its successful partnership with Maricopa County Elections in administering the election. As part of that partnership, the city hosted two Maricopa County-operated Vote Centers, providing convenient voting opportunities for residents throughout the election period.

Voters who need to cure a signature on their ballot may do so at Goodyear City Hall during regular business hours, as well as this Saturday and Sunday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

INFRASTRUCTURE & PROJECT UPDATES

SERAFINA SINKHOLE UPDATE

In October 2025, a sinkhole developed in the Serafina parking lot at Estrella Parkway and Goodyear Boulevard North following the failure of a private underground stormwater retention structure. City staff worked closely with the property owner to secure the site while repairs were completed. As of July 22, all repairs have been completed, and the parking lot has been fully reopened.

INFRASTRUCTURE & PROJECT UPDATES

TURF REPLACEMENT AT CIVIC SQUARE PARK (GSQ)

Beginning Monday, July 27, crews will begin sod replacement on the west portion of Civic Square Park. The turf replacement will address the over-seeded portion of the park that has been slow to transition to summer Bermuda from the winter Rye. During this project, the park will be closed to allow for safe movement of equipment. In addition, a portion of the parking area south of the park will be closed for material staging and dumping.

The park will reopen on Saturday, August 1, except for the newly installed turf areas. These sections will remain closed while the turf establishes. To support healthy growth, irrigation will run every few hours for approximately two weeks.



RAINBOW VALLEY WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY: EXPANSION (CIP #60077)

The Rainbow Valley Water Reclamation Facility Expansion project continues to progress on schedule through design and construction, supporting the planned increase in treatment capacity to two million gallons per day. Recent work includes concrete placement for the aeration basin deck, completion of deck electrical work, installation of APS duct bank infrastructure, initiation of the dewatering building, continued yard piping installation and delivery of clarifier equipment. The project remains on track for completion in June 2028.



INFRASTRUCTURE & PROJECT UPDATES

CAMELBACK ROAD: SR303 TO 152ND AVENUE (CIP #42038)

The Camelback Road improvement project continues to advance through the early stages of construction. Improvements include three travel lanes in each direction, bike lanes, a landscaped median, curb and gutter, sidewalks, drainage infrastructure and conduit installation. The project also includes relocation of the irrigation tailwater ditch along the north side of the corridor. Following contract award in June, the project is preparing to obtain final Development Services permits before construction activities begin. The project remains on schedule.



BULLARD AVENUE: CELEBRATE LIFE WAY TO ROOSEVELT STREET (CIP #42052)

The Bullard Avenue widening project remains in the design and property acquisition phases. The project will add a third southbound travel lane between Celebrate Life Way and Roosevelt Street, improving traffic flow and safety by eliminating the existing uneven lane configuration. Recent efforts have focused on property acquisition, utility coordination and stakeholder engagement to support future construction. The project remains on schedule for completion in March 2028.

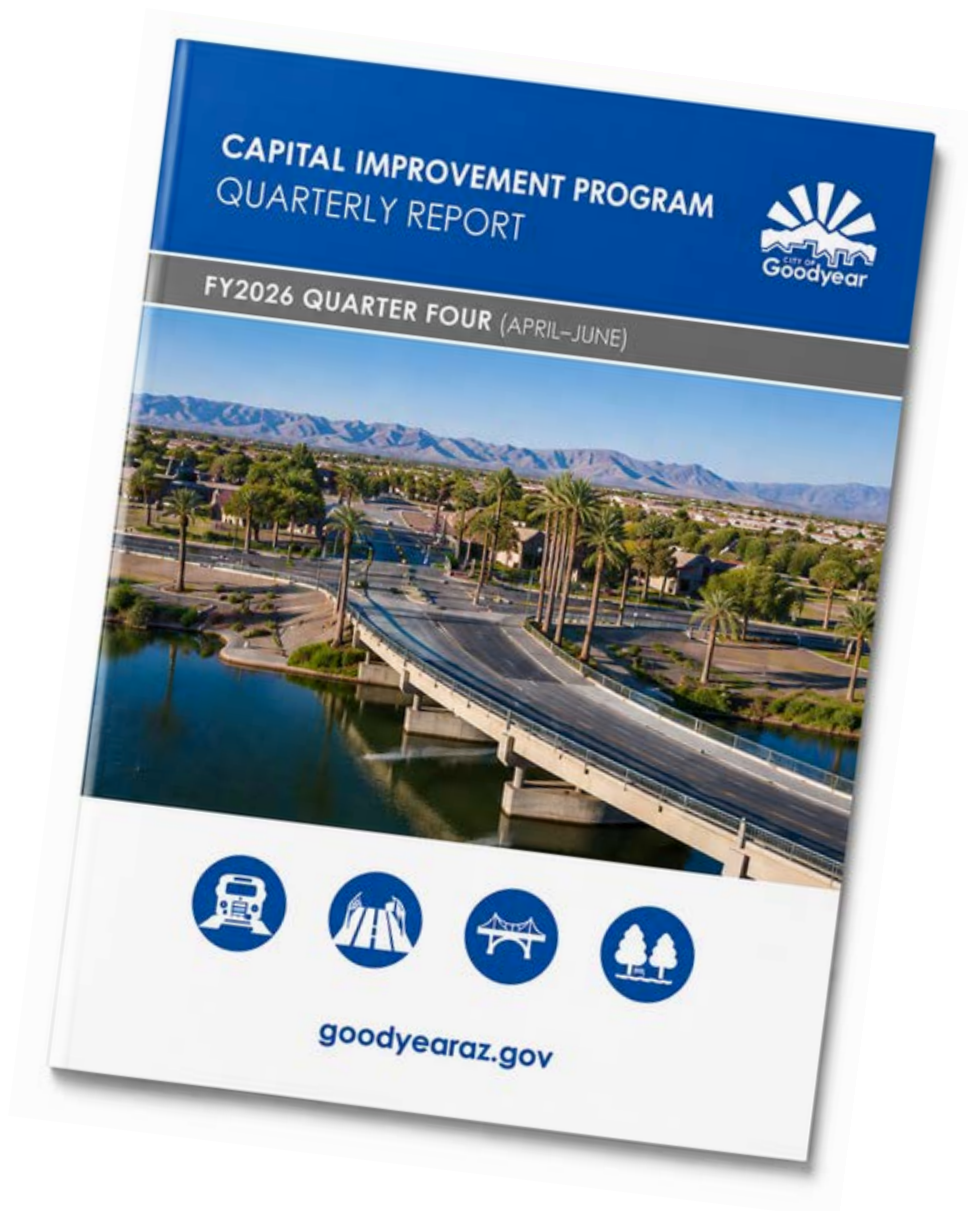

QUARTERLY JOB FAIR

The city's July 16 Job Fair at the Goodyear Recreation Campus welcomed 304 job seekers, 23 employers and two community resource partners. The event resulted in 17 onsite interviews, 81 scheduled interviews, 56 job offers and one immediate hire, demonstrating strong employer participation and candidate engagement.

Hosted in partnership with Maricopa County Workforce Development, the quarterly job fair continues to connect residents with employment opportunities while supporting the city's workforce development efforts.

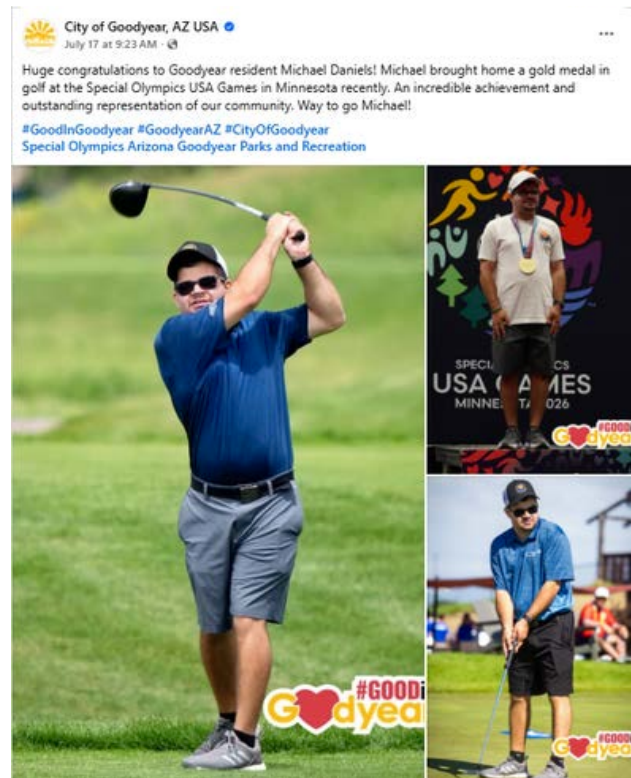

TOP POST OF THE WEEK

The week's top-performing post celebrated Goodyear resident Michael Daniels for winning a gold medal in golf at the 2026 Special Olympics USA Games in Minnesota. The post generated 2,438 engagements, including 753 reactions, 105 comments, 18 shares and 1,562 additional post clicks, reflecting strong interest in Daniels' achievement and the accompanying photos.

Sentiment was overwhelmingly positive, with commenters congratulating Daniels, praising his performance and expressing pride in his representation of Goodyear. The response demonstrates the strong engagement generated by resident success stories and the value of highlighting achievements that foster community pride and reflect positively on Goodyear.
